MCRMA POSITION STATEMENT ON CE MARKING OF CONSTRUCTION PRODUCTS

CE MARKING OF CONSTRUCTION PRODUCTS

Member companies within the Metal Cladding and Roofing Manufacturers Association (MCRMA) recognise and understand the requirements set out in the Construction Products Regulations 2011 (CPR) and where applicable issue or affix a CE mark to all individual products or component parts that form part of a recognised system.

The following products fall under the requirements of the CPR and may be included as part of a recognised system manufactured and supplied by a member company within the MCRMA.

- Profiled roofing and cladding EN 14782
- Composite panels EN 14509
- Sheeting fasteners CUAP 06.02/07
- Composite panel fasteners CUAP 02.06/12
- Spacer systems and halters CUAP 04.01/12
- Safety lines PPE 89/686/EEC
- Insulation products EN 13162:2008
- In plane rooflights EN 1013 (*awaiting publication*)
- Barrel rooflights EN 14963:2006
- Dome rooflights EN 1873
- Structural frame EN 1090-1

The construction industry is facing the most significant change for a decade in the way in which construction products are sold in Europe. From 1 July 2013, under the CPR, it will become mandatory for manufacturers to draw up a Declaration of Performance (DoP) and apply CE marking to any of their construction products which are covered by a harmonised European standard (hEN) or conforms to a European Technical Assessment (ETA) which has been issued for it, when such a product is placed on the market.

An ETA is based on a Common Understanding of Assessment Procedures (CUAP) for specific products. A CUAP is a procedure for innovative products which are not covered by a harmonised European standard. Manufacturers of construction products are not obliged to gain an ETA based on a product CUAP and in this situation manufacturers cannot apply a CE mark to the product.

Member companies within the MCRMA fully comply with the CPR and the business and technical ethos is acknowledged within the Membership Charter.

MCRMA members manufacture products to National and International standards and operate QA measures, such as EN ISO 9001, to ensure materials, processes and procedures are maintained to the highest standard.
